THE OBVARA PROCESS

The club for the first time tried a different way to get interesting effects on bisque pots - it is called the obvara firing process, which originated in Eastern Europe around the 12th Century. It involves scalding the finish on the pottery to seal the porous surface. Similar to the raku pottery process, a bisque pot is heated, in this case to around 900°C and removed from the heat. The difference is that the pot is then quickly dipped into a specific obvara yeast mixture before being dunked in water to rapidly cool the piece. The effects are quite stunning.

The traditional obvara brew recipe: -1 kg plain flour
2 packets dry yeast
1 tbsp sugar
10 l water

Mix yeast and sugar in warm water then add rest of water and mix flour into the mixture. Make the brew 3 days before use – leave in warm spot and stir once or twice a day.
