CARVING IN CLAY WORKSHOP Saturday 12 & Sunday 13 October

Renowned local potter Ellen Terrell will conduct this two day workshop, which will involve looking at suitable patterns, mixing and applying coloured slips, and using tools to make patterns both directly into leatherhard clay and also through the slips.

The aim of the workshop is to enable participants to take home decorated pots which can be glazed in their own time and kept as samples of the different aspects covered in the workshop.

The course will include a folder of hand-out sheets for each participant, covering information on slip & glaze recipes, a suggested list of tools and options for firing.

Arrive at 9.30am for a 10am start, until 4.30pm, with 30mins lunch each day (it is recommended you bring lunch so time is not wasted having to leave and buy food - For your convenience there is a kettle, fridge and microwave available for use in the club house).

WE ARE SEARCHING FOR ONE TEACHER'S AIDE FOR RUSSELL'S WORKSHOP


Russell needs someone to help prepare tools & materials, clean up and prepare morning and afternoon tea. This is a chance to listen, look and learn from a master!

THE NEW KILN HAS ARRIVED

The new kiln has arrived and been installed to the power supply. We thank Ken Ison and his team, as well as John Charlton our vice president, for helping get the kiln installed.

As we now have two kilns, we require a much tighter turn around on the use of each kiln, seeing we can only run one at a time. While the first kiln load is cooling, the second kiln load can start firing. This also requires the person using the kiln to be present at the end of their kiln firing, so they can read the electricity meter, before the next kiln / and next meter reading, gets underway.

Each kiln works the same way. We have printed out and laminated an operation sheet, which you will find near each kiln. The manual for the new kiln is also out the back if you wish to read about the kiln in more detail. If you are keen to learn more about loading and firing a kiln, please contact us.

Please note that we have also reprogrammed the types of firings, and these are the only ones to be used. If you need a new programme, you must not alter the kiln programme yourself, but instead contact Amanda McGahan - our kiln booking officer. We will discuss your request for a new programme and let you know if there are any problems, and if none then we will enter your new programme to the list.


SECOND HAND PUG MILL FOR SALE

KEEPING THE CLUB CLEAN AND TIDY

- Please clean the kitchen area after you use it. Hang out sponges and dish towels to dry
- Please remember to take your rubbish home with you as the Club does not have a
 council rubbish pick up service. We are trying hard to control the rat population in
 and around the club, therefore NO FOOD, SCRAPS, TEA BAGS etc TO GO INTO THE
 RUBBISH BIN.
- Please do not store your belongings at the Club. It would be brilliant and easy if we
 all could do this, but there simply is not enough room for everyone to be doing this.
 Come and take your items home ASAP! Any unclaimed pottery will be sold on by the
 club for the next experimental raku sessions, or disposed of.

IDENTIFY YOUR WORKS

If you plan to take the risk and leave your work in the clubhouse (please see final point above in 'keeping the club clean and tidy') then please leave a note with your work that contains the following info:

- Your name
- Your contact details
- Date when you plan to return to finish the work

This way we can at least have some idea how long work has been at the club for, and if it's been left untouched for more than one month, we will contact you to find out when you are coming back. If we cannot contact you, their is a high chance the items will be disposed of.
