
Glaze colour testing workshop

ARTIST OF THE MONTH

I was lucky enough to be born into a lineage of high achieving female artistic role models.

My grandmother was an art teacher, specializing in ceramics. My mother, Louise Feneley, is a very successful painter and art teacher (look up her work on www.louisefeneley.com). I played with clay a little as a youngster with my grandmother and loved observing her amazing work.

I have always been a hands-on kind of person, loving the tactile crafts of spinning, weaving, felt, crochet, wood carving, nontraditional basket making with recycled materials, and harp playing. Over and over again an artistic medium has captivated me—and I run with it until it becomes an obsession. Then I end up teaching it and inspiring others.

I worked at the Steiner school in Kuranda for five years as the woodwork and craft teacher. My four children went to the school as well. I loved supporting the students to achieve high quality work, building their confidence and fine motor skills in a therapeutic and productive environment.

Four years ago, I attended Cairns Potters Club for night classes with Yuki. Her classes, the club, and playing with clay inspired me. Astrid's pottery obsession had begun! However life got in the way and it was another three years before I ended up with a friend at TAFE for three terms, soaking up everything and working to produce as much as possible. Recently I made a pottery space and then started running Clay Play workshops from home. I am now fortunate enough to have the opportunity to run kids and adults' classes at the Cairns Potters Club.
