

Good news! We applied for a grant from the Gambling Community Benefit fund (GCBF) and we were successful in getting \$13,682 for a new electric kiln, which we hope to have installed by the end of July 2019.

MOTHER'S DAY FAIR - SAT 11 MAY 2019

Please arrive early – around 7am to set up your table in a good spot.

If you need a table for your display please contact Lone White to book a table (limited tables available). Lone's contact details are on the last page.

You can sell other things apart from pottery, such as glass works, paintings, jewellery, plants, fruit etc.

You will need to fill in a sales sheet with your name and contact details. You can pick up a sales sheet from the clubhouse or ask us to email you one. On the sales sheet you must include all the items for sale, and each item must each have a sticker with the item number, price and your initials. The club takes 20% commission from sales.

Drop your sales sheet at the Sales Table when you arrive. Make sure all the things for sale have a label attached with your initials, price and number.

You do not have to stay with your work all the time, but it would be good for promotion of your works.

All the works must be paid for at the sales table, and if you have time perhaps you can give a hand there.

At 2.00pm the Fair will close – so you will then have to come and pack up your unsold items and help clean up the grounds.

If you have nothing to sell, you are still welcome to come and help for a few hours. It will give you an opportunity to meet up with other potters and get to know about what is happening in the club. We will also need some helpers during the day for clay play with children.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

When you come to the Clubhouse you MUST sign IN and OUT in the book next to the entrance. Students attending classes must also have their names entered in the book, however the teacher running the class is responsible for doing this. It is an insurance requirement. Please take a moment when you next arrive to locate the book and fill it out when you arrive and leave.

RAKU GLAZE MAKING & FIRING DEMONSTRATION

The workshop to make raku glazes, and the raku firing, on 13 & 14 May was a huge success!

On Saturday we had around 8 club members attend and make up the glazes, of which there were 22 glazes made. It was very interesting to learn the process of mixing the various mineral and chemical compounds from John Charlton who volunteered in the glaze room, through to adding the right amount of water and learning how to mix the glaze well.

On Sunday we had a good turn-out of members who glazed their pieces and then waited in anticipation for the raku kiln to work its magic! As the kiln quickly reached the required temperature of 1000 degrees Celsius, the pieces were removed and placed into a fire proof container filled with gum leaves, grass, shredded paper and sawdust. The reason for this is to starve the pot of oxygen, which gives the glaze a wonderful variety of colours. Pieces with no glaze on them take the oxygen from the clay itself, meaning some areas will have a matte black colouring. Once they had cooled a little more, we then transferred the pieces into a tub of water to halt the firing process entirely. There were many excellent results, just a few of which are shown below.
