

ADULT WEEKEND WHEEL THROWING WORKSHOP for BEGINNERS WITH TUTOR RUSSELL FRENCH

Saturday 24 and Sunday 25 August \underline{AND} Saturday 7 and Sunday 8 September 9.00am to 4.00pm each day (1 hour lunch break) » 6hrs of lessons x 4 days = 24hrs in total

On the first weekend you will learn the basics of how to wheel throw and turn your pots.

A fortnight later, the second weekend will consist of learning glazing techniques.

Pots will be ready to collect on the the weekend of September 14/15 (exact date tbc).

We will have 6 spots available in this 4 day class. MEMBER: \$200 / NON-MEMBER: \$250

All materials and tools will be supplied and this cost includes up to 6kg of kiln firing per person. Please contact Lone for further information and to register your interest. Contact details are on the last page. Please note that payment needs to be received into our bank account before your application to participate is approved. Bank details are found on the bottom of page 6.

For your convenience there is a kettle, fridge and microwave available for use in the club house.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

When you come to the Clubhouse you MUST sign IN and OUT in the book next to the entrance. Students attending classes must also have their names entered in the book, however the teacher running the class is responsible for doing this. It is an insurance requirement. Please take a moment when you next arrive to locate the book and fill it out when you arrive and leave.

KEEPING THE CLUB CLEAN AND TIDY

- All members should respect the club and the facilities offered, and be considerate enough to clean up after they use the facilities.
- Please clean up after yourself, including cleaning of all bowls, tools, tables, sponges, wheels and surrounding floor. Take your wheel thrown slops home in a sealed bucket, do not leave at the machine.
- Please clean the kitchen area after you use it. Hang out sponges and dish towels to dry
- Please remember to take your rubbish home with you as the Club does not have a
 council rubbish pick up service. We are trying hard to control the rat population in
 and around the club, therefore NO FOOD, SCRAPS, TEA BAGS etc TO GO INTO THE
 RUBBISH BIN.
- Please do not store your belongings at the Club. It would be brilliant and easy if we
 all could do this, but there simply is not enough room for everyone to be doing this.
 Come and take your items home ASAP! Any unclaimed pottery will be sold on by the
 club for the next experimental raku sessions, or disposed of.

IDENTIFY YOUR WORKS

If you plan to take the risk and leave your work in the clubhouse (please see final point above in 'keeping the club clean and tidy') then please leave a note with your work that contains the following info:

- Your name
- Your contact details
- Date when you plan to return to finish the work

This way we can at least have some idea how long work has been at the club for, and if it's been left untouched for more than one month, we will contact you to find out when you are coming back. If we cannot contact you, their is a high chance the items will be disposed of.

NEW KILN IS ALMOST HERE

The new kiln is set to arrive in approximately two weeks! We have some work to do to prepare for its arrival. The floor of the kiln room will need to be cleared of all obstructions (shelves and other rubbish), and needs to be swept clean. The old kiln will need to be cold and empty as it must be disconnected and moved. As we do not know the exact date yet we can only pre-warn that there may be a period where this existing kiln can not be used. Please keep an eye on your inbox as we will email all the members regarding this once we do know the dates.

We will print out, and publish an operation manual for this kiln, once it is ready to use

KILN CONTROLLER SETTINGS

As notified in last months newsletter, we are looking to create a clear set of instructions for our kilns and we asked members to email us by Sun 30th June if there was a particular programme they prefer to use. We did not get a single email, therefore please note that we will go ahead and set new programs based on the best operational methods for our kilns. We will print out, and also publish these settings, so you are all aware of the changes.

ARTIST OF THE MONTH - GEOFF RILEY

My mother and my older sister were involved with pottery in the 80's and 90's. I still have some of their pieces at home today. The idea to try my hand at pottery had been in the back of my mind for years. I have never considered myself artistic which probably explains why I left it so long to try. Since then I have taken Yuki's evening classes in November and recently a Saturday wheel throwing class at the Tafe to improve my skills. The internet and Youtube are a constant source of inspiration and intrigue - "I wonder if I could do that", I ask myself. There are so many processes I would like to try, Naked Raku, Alcohol reduction & pit firing to name a few and the list keeps growing. (Geoff ticked alcohol reduction off his list last weekend! ~Ed)

In the future I want to learn how to fire my own pots and experiment with glazes. For now though, I have my own wheel at home to play with clay whenever I like. Pottery is my happy place.
